Leading the Way: Highlights from the 2024 National School Leaders Conference

This past November, 40 school leaders and members from their senior leadership teams from the East-West and Ohio Provinces of the SNDdeN network gathered in Cincinnati, OH, for the annual National School Leaders Conference. The event featured two engaging keynote sessions, thought-provoking workshops, and meaningful opportunities for collaboration.

Sister Patricia O'Brien, SNDdeN, opened the conference with an inspiring keynote, Shay: A Story of Leadership, emphasizing Gospel values and the transformative leadership principles of St. Julie.

Dr. Marcus Mescher, Associate Professor at Xavier University, followed with an enlightening session, Unpacking the Theology Behind the Hallmarks, exploring how the Hallmarks connect Catholic social teaching and Notre Dame de Namur's charism to modern education.

Workshops at the conference provided practical insights into global exchange programs, servant leadership, and nurturing future Catholic school leaders. Highlights included Chaminade Julienne's award-winning Senior Social Justice Capstone project, practical insights on fostering international partnerships, visit to the Sister Dorothy Stang, SNDdeN Room and Museum at the Ohio Province Center and a tour of Mount Notre Dame High School, featuring its innovative Learning Lab/Photovoltaic Lab and sustainability-focused education.

The conference concluded with a renewed sense of shared mission and purpose, as leaders departed with actionable strategies, deeper connections, and a collective commitment to advancing Notre Dame de Namur's values in their communities.


Celebrating Sister Dorothy Stang's Legacy Ways to Participate in 20th Anniversary Events



Nuns on the Bus Inspires Change at Notre Dame San Jose

On October 17, Notre Dame High School in San Jose hosted Nuns on the Bus, a transformative event aimed at inspiring civic engagement and social justice advocacy. The tour stop brought together students and Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur for an unforgettable experience that highlighted the power of collective action.

Addressing the student body, Sister Nancy O'Shea, SNDdeN underscored the importance of actively working for justice, drawing from the legacy of St. Julie Billiart:



"One of St. Julie's favorite sayings was 'teach them what they need to know for life.' Pay attention, notice who needs help, and get involved!"

Sister Nancy also shared her experiences volunteering with asylum seekers in Phoenix, AZ, describing their gratitude for basic necessities:

"Their appreciation for help with any small thing has stayed with me."



The event featured speeches by four Notre Dame San Jose students, each advocating for solutions to pressing issues: Hunger, Homelessness, Care for Creation, and Access to Mental Health Services. Kanika Rawat '26 spoke passionately about combating hunger:

"Having access to food is a fundamental human right, and all faiths call for us to address the issue of

hunger. ... We can address this by volunteering, donating, spreading awareness, and reducing our own food waste."

Kanika reflected on her opportunity to share the stage:

"I'm really happy I had the chance to speak alongside the amazing nuns and fellow students to advocate against hunger."

Sophia Walker '25 shared her impressions of the event, describing the Sisters' passion for change:

"They didn't just speak about justice; they lived it in a way that was powerful and

impossible to ignore. Hearing them speak made me realize how important it is to stand up for what's right."

Kanika echoed the sentiment, noting the event's lasting impact:

"I became more informed about the problems the world faces and how we need to advocate for change. I'll do my best to fight against these issues through service and advocacy."

Nuns on the Bus left the Notre Dame San Jose community with a renewed sense of hope and purpose. The Sisters and students alike demonstrated that everyone has the power to effect change by raising their voice, living their values, and working together to address critical issues.
